She has had 12 lifetime USMS records, and 8 lifetime All-American listings.

Steve West of Novaqatics Masters has been active in Masters swimming since 2006. In the past year, Steve set 3 new SPMS records upping his current number of SPMS records to 28. He set 3 new USMS records in the past year, and currently holds an impressive 22 USMS records. Steve set 3 FINA world records in the past year, adding to his total of 7 current FINA world records. In addition, Steve has five All-American listings for 2019, and 13 lifetime listings.

Steve participates not only in SPMS meets, but in USA Swimming meets where he is competitive with the best of the elite swimmers who are less than half his age.



ADULT LEARN TO SWIM PROGRAM AT SCM REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP MEET

December 12, 2019 SPP's ALTS Program "Debuts" at SPMS SCM Champs

For some of the swimmers from SilverPeak Performance, the Short Course Meters Championship Meet was not just a competition – it was validation.

Tenn Nuchkasem, 30, competed in the 100 Free, 50 Free, and the 400m Freestyle relay. "After going through a near-drowning experience at age six, I developed an abject fear of the water. I was never able to conquer that anxiety and enjoy the activity almost every kid does. Today, I am incredibly grateful for SilverPeak's Adult Learn-to-Swim program that equipped me with the skills to feel safe and confident in the water. The element of embarrassment in being an adult who doesn't know how to swim is eliminated by the very nature of this program.

With such a supportive environment and feeling that you're not alone, the program truly empowers you to take the steps to not only learn how to swim but to fall in love with the sport. I experienced this passion for swimming from being a part of an Adult Learn-to-Swim relay. With SPMS and SilverPeak providing the opportunity for new swimmers like me to experience the adrenaline of swimming in a race, I feel accomplished, grateful, and motivated to becoming a better swimmer."

Head Coach Charles McPeak gets teased a lot by our swimmers, because in situations like this, he usually gets something in his eye. "I thought I was doing something cool when I taught my wife how to swim. But, no offense Kris, that was nothing compared to what we are doing now with ALTS. It's the coolest and most important thing I've ever done."

SilverPeak Performance is approaching their second year with a grant from the Swimming Saves Lives Foundation, but Coach Charles has taught more than 100 adults to swim since starting SilverPeak in 2017.

Sandi Liu joined the ALTS program in late summer. "I was 100% land animal until three months ago, when I took my first Adult-Learn-To Swim lessons with SilverPeak Performance, where I learned to do a proper freestyle stroke (with my face in the water!) and breathe to the side. Coaches Charles and Anthony helped build my confidence in the water to the point where I participated in my first swim meet! It was very fun, exciting, and rewarding. SilverPeak Performance is a great supportive club for swimmers of all levels." Sandi was another swimmer who competed at the Short Course Meters Championship meet, coming home with ribbons and bragging rights. Her husband, Darren, was running a 50K race on the Saturday where Sandi did her first relay with SilverPeak! Talk about a focused family!

Pat Luangeaktrakul was specifically referred to the SilverPeak ALTS program by Holly Neumann of USMS. Pat joined us in spring and participated in the Long Course Meet at UCLA. Pat swam all three days of the swim meet at Long Beach. She told us, "I had a great time at the Long Beach (LB) Grunions swim meet because the team and officials were very nice and friendly. Members from the LB team thanked us for swimming and participating in the meet. This was my third swim meet since I learned how to swim with the Adult Learn to Swim Program. But this meet was special for me because it was the first time I started off the block and I completed in my individual longest distance (200m), plus two relays with teammates.

The Adult Learn to Swim Program has helped me feel comfortable in the water, and through Coach Charles, encouragement and positive coaching, I feel empowered with the tools and encouragement to become a better swimmer. Coach Charles is always very supportive, and knows how put his team at ease during our meets, especially when we are nervous. He made me feel like a part of the team no matter what level of swimmer I am, told me to have fun, and swim just like in practice. I did, and won three ribbons, and one medal."

SilverPeak looks forward to April when "Adult Learn to Swim" month is in full gear.

SWIMMING INTO THE SUNSET

Long time SPMS Masters swimmer Rob Hitchcock, of Simi Valley, passed away in October, doing what he loved most - swimming.

A swim coach and board member for the Simi Valley Family YMCA, Hitchcock could be found almost daily in or beside the pool, whether swimming himself or coaching the many kids, teens and adults who came to him for guidance. When not swimming, Rob loved his community to which he gave freely of his time. He was active in coaching, his church, Rotary, and was a member of the Ventura County Search and Rescue team in addition to leading and participating in many service projects, including chairing the 2016 Simi Valley Cajun & Blues Festival.


Deanna Koehler, who got to know Rob early on in her Masters swimming career, shared her thoughts on Rob and their swimming centered relationship:

"As a young twenty something, fresh out of competitive swimming, I extended my love of swimming by teaching adults through the Rancho Simi Recreation and Park District. Rob Hitchcock was a swimmer in my class. He exuded such an interest in competitive swimming. Twenty-one years older than me, Rob became my mentor and most valuable resource. Without hesitation Rob took the lead and guided me through transforming my lap swimmers into bona fide competitive Masters swimmers as together Rob and I formed the Simi Valley Seaturtles. Philanthropic Rob was unstoppable. He found an animator to create our stylish tee shirts and team logo. Hats and swimsuits were silkscreened with the logo and Rob ordered parkas and jackets. I still treasure the Seaturtle parka Rob bought me embroidered "Coach". This was the first time I was Coach. Thanks to Rob, we were the most "put together" spirited team in USMS. Our small size, under 15 members, did not lack enthusiasm as we competed in numerous Masters meets and ocean swims. The Turtles disbanded in 1999 but that never stopped Rob from seeking swimming knowledge from any coach in the Southern California area, who'd accept his offer of coffee and pastry at Panera's in exchange for the ability to pick their brains for stroke technique and team advice. This knowledge was used to form Rob's Y team, the Stingrays. If you needed a place to swim, Rob would have a quest pass at the ready for you to swim at the Y with his team. Just last summer I came to the Simi Y to get in a swim workout and of course Rob was there teaching as well as inspiring a young teenager to swim. All for free. Volunteering was Rob's pleasure. Rob Hitchcock was a Swim Hero who died with his Speedo on, just like all true swimmers want to go."

The SPMS family will miss Rob and his infectious passion for swimming.
